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# What are they?

- ▶ They are physical or behavioral checkpoints in children development as they grow.
- ▶ They are things that most children can do at a certain age
- ▶ Different children attain milestones differently
- ▶ A delay can be when a child does not attain skill by upper range of age

► Milestones can be grouped in these categories

- Gross motor - sitting, crawling, walking ,jumping
- Fine motor - eye hand coordination, picking small objects, stacking toys
- Language skills- hearing, understanding and using language
- Cognitive skills- problem solving, reasoning, thinking, learning
- Social interaction- getting along with people, playing

# Gross Motor skills

- ▶ Head support (0-3 months)
- ▶ Pushes up on arms and holds head up
- ▶ Moves fists from closed to open
- ▶ Brings hand to mouth
- ▶ Supports self with hands while sitting (4-6 months)
- ▶ Rolls from back to tummy to back
- ▶ Plays with feet while lying on his back
- ▶ Transfers toys from one hand to the other
- ▶ Sits unsupported( 7-9 months)
- ▶ Crawls

- ▶ Pulls to stand can cruise along furniture( 10-12 months)
- ▶ Stands alone and takes several independent steps
- ▶ Walks independently( 13- 18 months)
- ▶ Can squat to pick a toy
- ▶ Climb stairs with rail
- ▶ Throws ball
- ▶ Walks up stairs (21 months)
- ▶ Jumps up and down ( 24 months)
- ▶ Tiptoe, kick ball
- ▶ Hops, stands on one foot 2 sec(4 yrs.)
- ▶ Stand on one foot 10 sec ( 5 yrs.)
- ▶ hops and may skip

# Fine motor skills

- ▶ Rattles toy (0-3 months)
- ▶ Palmar grasp( 5 months)
- ▶ Reaches, grasps and put object in mouth
- ▶ Transfer objects from one hand to the other( 7 months)
- ▶ Pick things with pincer grasp ( 6-9 months)
- ▶ Build tower of 3 cubes( 1-2 yrs)
- ▶ Hold 2 cubes
- ▶ Can zip clothes(large) 2-3yrs
- ▶ Fasten and unfasten large buttons
- ▶ Holds pen with thumb and finger
- ▶ Uses fork, cut with scissors following a straight line (4-5yrs.)
- ▶ Can copy shapes

# Language skills

- ▶ Cooing ( 2 months)
- ▶ Reacts to sounds and noises( 4-6 months)
- ▶ Consonant sounds when babbling like da, da, da
- ▶ Listens and responds when spoken to
- ▶ Babbling (6 months)
- ▶ Recognizes sound of their name
- ▶ Mama, dada ( 9 months)
- ▶ Says “mama” or “dada” meaningfully (11-12 months)
- ▶ Says one or two words
- ▶ Imitates speech
- ▶ Can identify 1-2 body parts when named (15 months)

- ▶ 2-3 word phrases (2 yrs.)
- ▶ names 3 objects
- ▶ says no
- ▶ Knows name, age, sex (2 -5 yrs.)
- ▶ Converses 4 years



# Social interaction

- ▶ Focus on face( 4 weeks)
- ▶ Social smile ( 6 weeks)
- ▶ Smiles spontaneously (4 months)
- ▶ Knows familiar faces ( 6 months)
- ▶ Plays with others
- ▶ Scared of strangers( 6-9 months)
- ▶ Cries when parents leave( 12 months)
- ▶ Shows fear in some situations

- ▶ Simple pretend play ( 18 months)
- ▶ Points at things
- ▶ Plays with other children( 2yrs)
- ▶ More independence
- ▶ Takes turns in games (3 yrs)
- ▶ Dress and undress self
- ▶ Understands “mine”, “his” , “hers”
- ▶ Cooperates with other children and prefers to play with other children( 4yrs)
- ▶ Enjoys doing new things

# Cognitive skills

- ▶ Follows things with eyes and recognize people ( 2 months)
- ▶ Lets you know if he is happy or sad ( 4 months)
- ▶ Reaches for toy with one hand
- ▶ Looks around at things nearby ( 6 months)
- ▶ Curiosity for things and tries to get things out of reach
- ▶ Looks for things they see you hide( 9 months)
- ▶ Plays peek-a-boo
- ▶ Explores things in different ways like throwing , banging, shaking (1yr)
- ▶ Bangs 2 things together
- ▶ Put things in and out of container

- ▶ Knows the use of different items like spoon, phone, brush ( 18 months)
- ▶ Points to get peoples attention
- ▶ Points to one body part
- ▶ Play simple believe play ( 2 years)
- ▶ Follows 2 step instructions
- ▶ Copies a circle( 3yrs)
- ▶ Build a tower of more than 6 blocks
- ▶ Can name colors and numbers( 4 yrs.)
- ▶ Can copy shapes like Triangle (5 yrs.)
- ▶ Can count 10 or more things

# Conclusion

- ▶ Parents need to be on watch for any delays and consult a doctor whenever they are concerned
- ▶ With early intervention a child can catch up on the milestones they have not attained
